Saint George Code Enforcement

Did you know?

It is the duty of the owner of any premises abutting on any street, avenue, sidewalk or alley in the city to cut and trim all trees, hedge fences, bushes, vegetation of shrubbery in such a manner that the foliage, boughs or limbs thereof shall not obstruct free and convenient travel or vision upon the street, avenue, sidewalk, or alley.

Saint George Code Enforcement

Did you know?

Owners shall remove all dead, diseased or dangerous trees, or broken or decayed limbs which constitute a menace to the safety of the public. The city shall have the right to cause the removal of any dead or diseased trees on private property within the city, when such trees constitute a hazard to life and property.

Did you know?

Buildings shall have approved address numbers placed in a position to be plainly legible and visible from the street or road fronting the property.

These numbers shall contrast with their background. Address numbers shall be Arabic numerals or alphabet letters. Numbers shall be not less than 4 inches (102 mm) in height with a minimum stroke width of .05 inch (12.7 mm)

Help Us, Help You by being able to find you in an emergency!

With the upcoming change of seasons please remember whenever snow has accumulated or there is a possibility that snow will accumulate to such a depth that snow removal operations will be required, City Administration may declare a traffic emergency. If this happens, notice will be given through local press, radio, and other media. During a snow emergency there is no parking on primary and secondary snow routes, which are: First Street—200 block, Lincoln Street, Wildcat Way, Snyder Drive, Lockett Lane.
