a. 6th St - Update

Brian Foster updated council that some seeding has been done. Council agreed to wait until fall and ask that this be reseeded.

b. City Hall – Update

Brian Foster talked with City Council about some dirt that has been located for the Municipal Facility (City Hall). A proposal was put together by Benkendorf Trucking. This was a rough grading plan and a cerbal price of \$15.5/cubic yard. There is approximately 16, 500 cubic yards bringing the total to #255, 750.00 and then removal of the storage sheds on the property and a tree for an additional \$5000.00.

Judd McCormack made a motion to accept the proposal from Mr. Richard Benkendorf:

Mr Benkendorf is to provide and haul approximately 16, 500 cubic yards of fill material to the future municipal hall site located at the southwest corner of Lincoln Avenue and East 1st Street in Saint George, Kansas. Me. Benkendorf is then to provide the grading and compaction of said fill material on site. In addition to earthwork activities, Me. Benkendorf is to provide the removal of the existing building, concrete pads, and a large tree located on the east side of the site along Lincoln Avenue. The earthwork activities for this project is to be provided at a cost of \$15.50/cubic yard for an approximate total of \$255,750.00 The demolition activities for this project to be provided at a lump sum cost of \$5,000.00. This is contingent upon financing and budget recommendation.

Matt Ruhnke seconded the motion.

Motion carried with 3 Ayes 0 Nays

Brian Foster also brought a contract for Teracon. They will do earth samples and testing for the Municipal Facility area. Judd McCormack made a motion to accept the Terracon proposal of \$6,500.00, and an hourly rate up to \$1500.00. Nick Cahoj seconded the motion.

Motion carried with 3 Ayes 0 Nays

Brians last item brought to Council was the rail road right of way. Brian suggested that we put in a bid offer of \$1.00. Matt Ruhnke made a motion to approve the bid offer to the rail road for \$1.00.
